

March 2, 2019

The MSPE Board of Directors held a special Board meeting at the MSPE office to consider and approve the association management services contract for Braden Heidner Lowe & Associates for the 2019-2020 fiscal year. In the previous several weeks, the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors voted to move forward with a renewed contract, per the recommendations from the Moving Missouri Forward Committee.





# MSPE Executive Committee Meeting Recap

April 5, 2019

The MSPE Executive Committee held its quarterly meeting at the MSPE office on April 5. The meeting included several heavy lift items, including the review of the proposed budget submitted by Treasurer Mitch Kyrsa. The budget for the next fiscal year (July 1, 2019-June 20, 2020) will be considered by the Board of Directors in June.

A candidate slate was approved as recommended by the Nominating and Tellers Committee, chaired by Past President Ron Black. Updates were also provided regarding membership, The Government Relations Committee, Annual Convention, 2019 Fall PDH Days and the Awards Committee.





# MSPE Bylaws Amendment to be Considered at MSPE Conference

Amendment Condenses MSPE Board of Directors Size with Weighted Voting for Chapters

This announcement serves as official notice of a proposed amendment to be considered by the membership during the annual convention at Lake Ozark on Monday, June 17 at 2:30 PM. The amendment proposes condensing the MSPE Board of Directors from 30 to 24 directors by allowing each chapter to have a single Board representative that has weighted voting.

President Michael Purol and President-elect Bob Becnel asked the Bylaws Committee, chaired by Ross Kasmann, to consider the amendment. MSPE currently has the largest Board of Directors among the state societies across the The "weighted voting" concept reduces the Board size while allowing each chapter to keep their respective voting power. For example, the Ozark Chapter would name one person as their Board representative who will attend Board meetings and carry three votes. The Jefferson City Chapter would send one person and carry two votes. This way the Board is smaller and more manageable but chapters are not being harmed by taking away any voting power.

The amendment is modeled off of how the NSPE House of Delegates works. Each state/territory has one person in the HOD and they have different votes based on their membership size.

Pursuant to ARTICLE XVII, Section 3, the Bylaws Committee has brought this amendment forward. Because the proposed amendment is a "governance" change, the process to approve is to present the amendment to the membership in writing with 30 days' notice (published in the Spring Missouri Engineer) and at the convention's membership meeting members can vote to approve or disapprove. The changes must be approved by a 2/3 majority of members at the meeting to prevail.



After the first in person meeting, the

main focus areas were as follows: Shaping of Public Policy, Educating for the Future, Communicating Powerfully to Critical Audiences, Diversity of Tomorrow's Engineer, and Engaging the State Societies and NICET. Based on the discussion in the last meeting, these were viewed as still pertinent, but that more individual focus should be given to NICET and the State Societies. With this in mind, there are eight key areas that came out of the March strategic planning meeting. These key areas include: NICET wins over the next 1-3 years, State Society wins over the next 1-3 years, Re-engineering governance regarding NSPE, Shaping of Public Policy, Educating for the Future, Communicating Powerfully to Critical Audiences, Diversity of Tomorrow's Engineer, and the last one is Creating or Building Buzz. These areas will continue to be refined as we move forward to unveiling the strategic plan at the NSPE PECON meeting in Kansas City in July. Speaking of NSPE PECON, the registration and the hotel block are now open for the meeting. In addition to the National NSPE PECON meeting, Kansas and Missouri are working towards each state's annual meeting that will be held in June. I wanted to take this moment to thank all of the volunteers from Kansas and Missouri who have helped plan each of these meetings and will help make them a success.



Within in the region, we hold monthly calls with state leaders and executive directors to discuss best practices, answer questions, or just share recent events taking place within each state. We are also at the middle point or approaching the end of this year's legislative sessions in many of our states. ### Bridge Contest

The Jefferson City Chapter of MSPE held its Fourth Annual Model Bridge Building Competition on Wednesday March 6 at the Jefferson City High School's Nichols Career Center Building. Contestants designed and constructed basswood model bridges and then the bridges were loaded until a point of failure. The contestants were split into

middle school, high school, and challenge divisions. The winning bridge had a structural efficiency of over 1500%!! The full results are included below. These events are a great way to get kids evolved in STEM. A huge thanks goes out to everyone who made the event a success and to all the contestants.

## Ozark Chapter News

### Bridge Contest

Members of the Ozark Chapter and the Student Chapter at MSU came out in force on Wednesday, March 27 to support the 30th Annual MSPE Model Bridge Contest. The event, intended to challenge the creative ability of the students and to promote interest in the engineering profession, was held at Hammons Student Center at Missouri State University in conjunction with the Ozarks Science and Engineering Fair. The contest was open to area students in grades 5 through 12. Additionally, there were categories for Teachers / Sponsors, Engineering College Students, and area Engineers. Participants constructed bridges of 3/32" x 3/32" basswood sticks to span an opening of 300 mm (11-13/16") with the bridge mass being less than 20 grams (for reference, 20 grams is the weight of approximate 8 pennies!) and meeting other dimensional specifications. These bridges were loaded to failure at the contest, with the winners determined on the "efficiency" of the bridge (the failure load divided by the bridge mass), with

the exception of the Middle School Division, where the winners were determined based solely on the highest failure load. It is noteworthy that the top finishers in every category had bridges that carried in excess of 100 pounds!

This year a total of 349 basswood bridges constructed by local students representing 39 classes from 31 area schools were loaded to failure. Additionally, seven bridges were constructed by local engineering students and teachers/sponsors.

Finally, congratulations are also due Mr. Ryan Carlton of Ozark High School who took the class efficiency award with an average efficiency of 2,896.6 and a class average break weight of over 100 pounds.

Cash prizes and framed certificates will be awarded to these top contestants to commemorate their achievement. Additionally, as the top two finishers in the High School Division, Joshua and Logan were eligible to participate in the International Model Bridge Contest, held on Saturday,

April 6 in Baltimore, MD on the Homewood Campus of John Hopkins University.

### 18th Annual Regional Model Bridge Contest

On Tuesday, March 5, 2019 the Southwest Chapter of the Missouri Society of Professional Engineers held the 18th Annual Regional Model Bridge Contest at Missouri Southern State University in the Billingsley Student Center from 6 to 8 pm.

Bridges are designed and built by high school students using 3/32" x 3/32" lengths of Basswood. The bridge specifications require a maximum weight of 25 grams with maximum dimensions of length 350 millimeter by width 75 millimeter by height 100 millimeter.

The top three finishers received cash prizes of \$100, \$50 and \$25 respectively.

First place was Vanessa Enslow, a sophomore at East Newton High School. Her bridge weighed 17.87 grams and carried 45.5 pounds for an efficiency ratio of 1,154.92. Her school sponsor is Richard Enslow.

Second place was Joshua Patterson, a senior at Neosho High School. His bridge weighed 23.34 grams and carried 48.0 pounds for an efficiency ratio of 932.84. His school sponsor is Mark Preston.

Third place was Blake Williams, a junior at Neosho High School. His bridge weighed 13.46 grams and carried 25.0 pounds for an efficiency ratio of 842.48. His school sponsor is Mark Preston.

Thirty students from four area high schools participated in the contest. The average efficiency ratio was 474.5.

Vanessa Enslow and Joshua Patterson were eligible to participate in the International Bridge Building Contest in Baltimore, MD on April 6, 2019.



Erin offered example programs such as MathCounts, Engineers' Week STEM Science Center educational

stations, and even the PE Refresher Course aimed at helping preparing engineers about to take the PE exam for licensure.
